Thaddeus Edward (Thad) Lukasik] passed away peacefully on October 30, 2024 at the age of 88. He was surrounded by his wife and children. Born on January 18, 1936, in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, Thad was a cherished member of his community. Having lost his father at age 11, his extended Polish family of grandmother, uncles, aunts and cousins helped raise Thad, his brother Edward and sister Patricia. Through them, Thad developed a loving spirit and respect for family

Life and Legacy

Thad enlisted in the United States Marine Corps shortly after graduating from high school. His college acceptance arrived after he had enlisted, so he devoted his energies to becoming a Marine. After his tour of duty, Thad was honorably discharged in California, where he met his first wife, Faye Berquist, and they subsequently had five children. Faye passed away in 1972. Faye and Nancy Kesselring were best friends when Thad and Faye were married. Nancy's husband, Wayne W. Sanders, passed away in 1973. Two years later, Thad and Nancy were married to support each other and to raise their combined seven children. Thad was very active during the last 20+ years with the Emerald Empire Marine Corps League, the Emerald Empire Young Marines Program, and Toys for Tots. He loved God, his country, and doing the right thing, whether for family, friends, or a stranger in need.

Family and Friends

Thad is survived by his wife of 49 years, Nancy, Thad's children (Debra Louise Michalek, Tamra Lynn Lawton, Lauren Angela Locke, Thaddeus Edward Lukasik II (Tad) and Juliana Marie Lukasik); his sister Patricia and her husband James Laskowski, and his brother Edward Lukasik and Nancy's two children (Kevin (Linet) Sanders and Kathy Bonitz). Grandchildren include Debbie's Steven and Gwen; Tamra's Stephan Lawton (deceased), Rob Lawton, James Lee (deceased), and Krista Larbig; Lauren's Selene, and Kevin's Brendan. There are several great-grandchildren. Thad also leaves behind many great and caring friends. Thad's love of family, football, soccer (all sports, really), all children and his friends will live on in the hearts of those who were fortunate enough to know him. And he never missed a Pittsburgh Steelers' game!

Thad couldn't find a place where his children could play soccer so, being a resourceful man, he became the first local regional director for the American Youth Soccer Organization (AYSO). Thad was instrumental in bringing the sport of soccer to the Eugene/Springfield area.

The couple has traveled to Alaska, Canada, the Western Caribbean, Switzerland and England. There were also many trips to Pennsylvania to visit with family members there. 

The Distinguished Citizen Award (Gold) was awarded at the National Level of the Marine Corps League and signed by the National Commandant Richard Gore, Sr. Thad's continued involvement and support of the United States Marine Corps, the Marine Corps League, Toys-for-Tots, and Emerald Empire Young Marines has drawn the attention of not only his fellow detachment members, but also the Department of Oregon, and the National Level of the Marine Corps League. His achievement is in keeping of the highest traditions of the United States Marine Corps, and the Marine Corps League.

Also in July 2017, Thad Lukasik was presented with his 2nd Distinguished Citizen Award (Bronze) by Emerald Empire Detachment Commandant Joseph Lamm.

When a vehicle left running in his neighbors driveway caught fire, Thad and another neighbor worked to summon the fire department while also ensuring that the elderly woman (in a wheelchair) got out of the house as the vehicle fire spread to the house.
