
Bill and Shirley are survived by their daughter Diane Barnes, and son William Arvil Cummings, III.

So, they went to the Evergreen Aviation & Space Museum and the Wings and Waves waterpark. Both locations are right next to each other in McMinnville, Oregon.







That puts our little Detachment at nine people residing in this home. On top of all that our beloved b a t f agency has taken my license and will not reinstate me until I have a commercial location for at least 3 months. This would be nearly impossible, so I'm no longer self-employed. This puts us in a very vicarious situation. The doctors have insisted that I need to be on disability and retire. That won't give us enough money to even begin to support nine Souls. I'm doing the best I can with what I got to work with, so please keep the Bowker Detachment in your prayers. Once again Paul thank you so much for the kind gesture and blessings to the entire 917 Robert Bowker

Thank you, the wood supply is great. We had giant winds here and that took down several trees. We have wood for this winter.

OBITUARY – JAMES 'JIM' HENRY HALE

Jim Hale passed into the pearly gates of heaven on July 2, 2024, at his home in Gamewell, NC. He served our Lord faithfully these last 40 years wherever he lived and in each church he attended. James Henry Hale was born Dec 30, 1938 in Stark City, MO, and was the son of the late Owen Gordon Hale and Mildred Georgia Garrett. He was also preceded in death by a sister, Donna Forbes and brother, Butch.

He joined the Marine Corps in Jan 1956. He served in Morroco; Iwakuni, Japan; 29 Stumps; Camp Pendleton; Camp Lejeune; Vietnam. He felt his greatest assignment was leading a debriefing team for "Operation Homecoming" when the POWs came home from Hanoi.

In 1983 he moved to Lompoc, CA and began attending Trinity Church of the Nazarene. It was there that he met and married his soulmate and best friend, Diana Lee Arthur McCrary. They married June 22, 1985 and Jim gained 2 bonus daughters, Debbie Lee and Susan Marie.

In 1986 he began working for U. S. Secret Service at President Ronald Reagan's Ranch. Jim later transferred to Wash, D.C. where he drove our First Ladies between 1989 – 2001. During these years he was fortunate enough to travel to 65 countries in conjunction with my driving assignments. Jim was transferred to the Field Office of San Francisco; while there he was assigned to drive such dignitaries as President Putin of Russia, President Chirac of France, former Presidents Ford, Carter and Clinton, and other foreign leaders visiting our country. He retired Jan '04 and returned to Grants Pass with his bride.


Jim was a charter member of the Rogue Valley Det of Marine Corps League, having served the first year as Sr. Vice, and 2nd year as Commandant; he subsequently became the Oregon State Commandant. He also worked with the Young Marines of Merlin, OR in conjunction with the MCL. In Grants Pass, he attended Grace Bible Church where he served as Board Chairman for 8 years, manned the grill at the New Hope Christian School booth during the fair each year, golfed, and hung out each morning with his peers at both The Powderhorn Café and the Donut Shop. He and his wife, Diana have supported missionaries in both Things to Come and Grace Ministries International programs for 19 years and personally adopted into their family a couple from Malawi, Africa and personally support and nurture they and their daughter, Heather, while she attends Grace Christian University in Grand Rapids, MI.

Jim moved to Lenoir, NC in April 2018 where he shared a home with his bride. He attended Waterlife Church and loved to greet attendees at their 9 a.m. services. Prior to his medical decline the past 18 months, he loved to golf, walk at Broyhill Park, travel, and dine at both Paula's Diner and Southern Crossroads and hangout with the guys at Hudson DAV

Survivors in addition to his wife are daughters: Carol Holland (Murf), Susan Cooper (Mike), Debbie (Jason), and Shannon Van Boven, 11 grandchildren and 8 great-grandchildren. Minutes of the meeting 21 August 2024

- 2. Roll Call of Officers. All officers were present except the Sergeant-At-Arms and Webmaster, who were absent.
- 3. Application for Membership. None.
- 4. Balloting. N/A
- 5. Ceremony of Initiation. N/A
- **6. Minutes of previous meeting.** A motion was made by Paul Grinde to waive the reading of the minutes and to accept the minutes as published. Dan Stombaugh second. Motion passed.

- c) Thad Lukasik had a reaction to barium last week. His doctor said that his pancreatic cancer is decreasing and that he is doing better. He is still taking chemo therapy.
- d) Nancy Lukasik is having heart problems and is experiencing shortness of breath.

10. Report of Officers.

- a) Senior Vice Commandant Steve Price thanked all those who attended the memorial service for Bill and Shirley Cummings.
- b) Junior Vice Commandant Paul Grinde reported that three more annual payers have remitted their dues.

11. Report of Standing Committees.

- a) Young Marines The Young Marines were going on a camping trip but with insufficient adult supervision plans have changed to a trip to see antique aviation and a water park. They are still looking for adult volunteers. Lois Price stated that they have identified the Marine Corps League/Young Marines liaison and she has contacted him regarding administrative problems. Senior Vice Commandant Steve Price will have a work party at the camp on 6 September 2024.
- b) Toys for Tots No report.
- c) Veteran's Legacy Junior Past Commandant reported that he has been unable to visit Camp Alma as he is assigned to grand jury duty. Craig Myers stated that he has been contacted regarding the establishment of a ham radio station at Camp Alma. The equipment will be donated by retiring ham operator. He has also been requested to set up a link between Camp Alma and Roseburg.

14. New Business.

- a) Junior Past Commandant Dave Huber proposed that the detachment purchase a potted plant to give Melissa for her participation at the breakfast. Senior Vice Commandant Steve Price second. During the discussion the motion was amended to a gift card in the amount of fifty dollars (\$50.00) from Gray's. Motion passed.
- b) Senior Vice Commandant motioned to create a fund for the Detachment Chaplain in order to purchase cards and postage. The Chaplain Joy Cavin declined stating she would submit receipts as items were purchased.
