Jay donated many items for our last Mid-Winter Conference, and has been on the email list for quite some time. Jay attended the May meeting as a visitor.



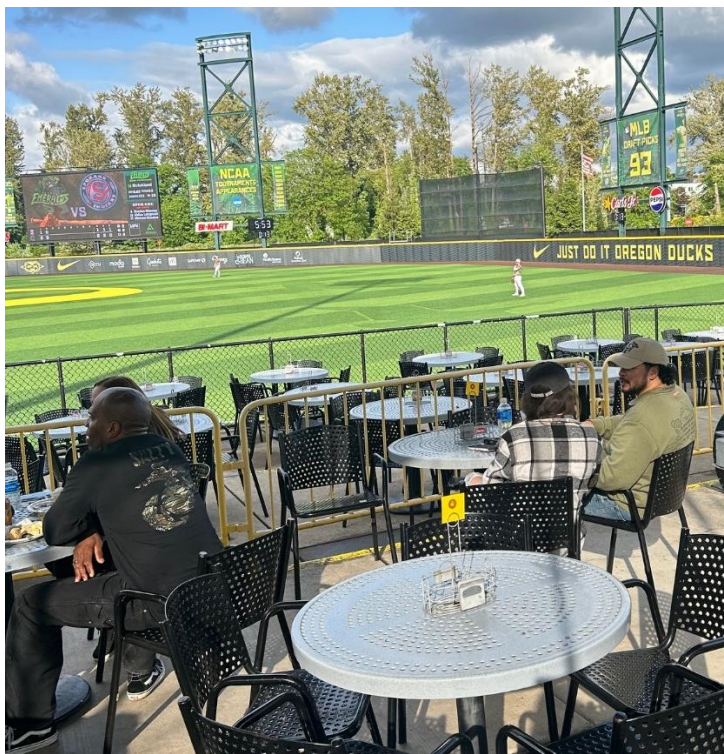

The start of the game was a little damp, but we had some sun breaks. The chill and wind arrived in the later innings.



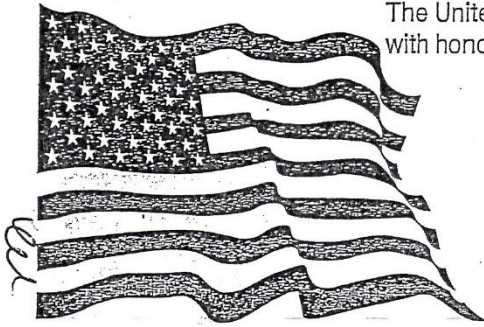
Paul & Amy Grinde also attended. Paul busy taking photos, and Amy doing her best to hide.



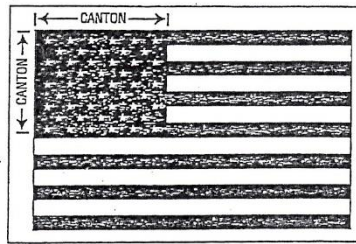

Displaying The United States Flag

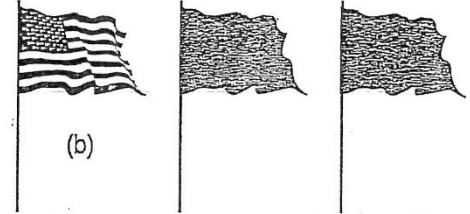
The United States Flag should be displayed with honor as it represents our great nation.



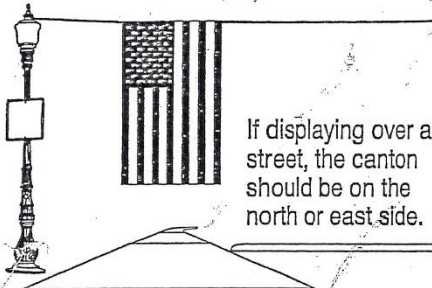
Canton: Top inner corner of the flag.
(The blue field with white stars.)



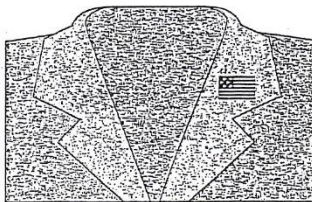
Displaying the flag with other flags. a) Above other flags when flown on the same pole. b) With other flag poles, the United States flag should be displayed to its right. It should be the first one hoisted and the last one lowered.



Displaying the flag from a building or house. From a staff mounted on the building. Vertical in a window with the canton to the flags right. Or hang the Flag from a rope with the canton away from the building or home.



If displaying over a street, the canton should be on the north or east side.

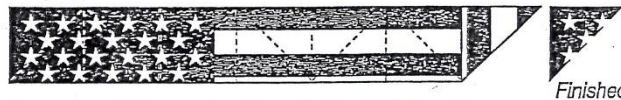


Displaying a lapel pin, should be worn on the left lapel near your heart.



Displaying The United States Flag on its right and the staff on top of all others. In a group of flags, it should be in the center and its tip the highest.

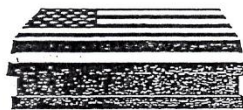
After displaying the flag, it should be carefully folded and stored. **Folding the U. S. Flag:** Fold twice lengthwise, and starting at the stripes end, fold into triangles as shown.



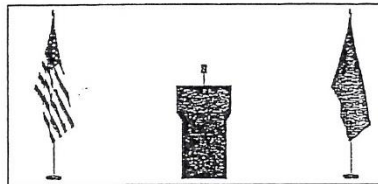

Care and Disposal of the United States Flag

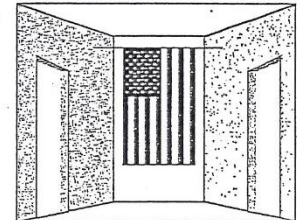
The United States Flag may be mended. It may also be washed or dry-cleaned. Some dry-cleaners will provide this service free of charge. When a Flag has become no longer fit for being displayed, it should be destroyed. Its destruction should be in a dignified way, burning is recommended.



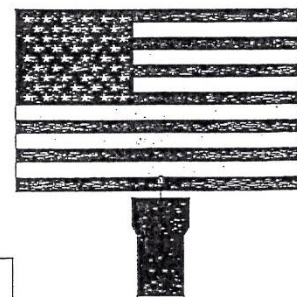
On a Casket, drape the Flag so the Canton is at the head and over the left shoulder of the body. Never lower the Flag into the grave.



Displaying the Flag at the speaker's right side. (Above) Or flat against the wall behind the speaker. (Right) Never use as a decoration of any kind.



When hanging the Flag in a lobby, or corridor, it should be displayed on the opposite side of the main entrance, the canton should be displayed to the person's left as they come in the main entrance door.

Disabled veterans

Oregon residents who are disabled veterans (**with a rating of at least 25 percent**) are eligible for a FREE combination license that includes hunting, fishing and shellfish licenses and a Columbia River Basin Endorsement.

Resident disabled veterans also can qualify for a \$26 elk tag.
First time license applicants must submit

This application, and

A letter from the U.S. Veterans Administration, or any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States, showing an overall disability rating of at least 25 percent.

Pat & Lois did a complete field day on the cook shack went thru everything, then started on study area did the same thing threw out what was not needed cleaned and moped the floor.

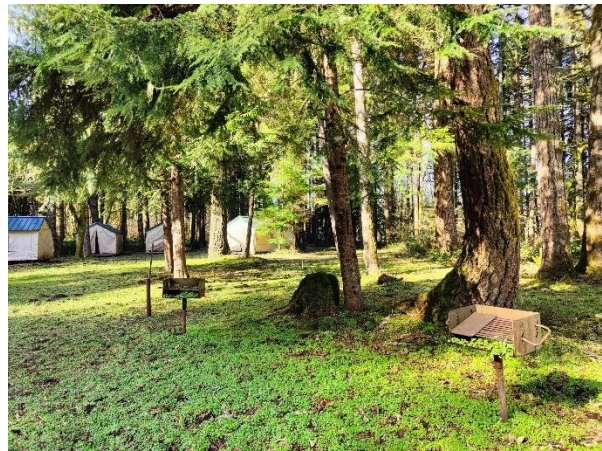

We currently have 1 new recruit who has completed his application and 3 new interest forms. Interest forms don't always amount to new recruits, but I am following up with each and every one in order to grow our unit. We have two new Adult Volunteers, Graham Hillson and Summer Martin. We are hoping to recruit some more eager Adult Volunteers as Pat & Terry, Steve & Lois are all trying to take a step back and turn this program over to a younger generation. They will all ALWAYS be welcome to participate in whatever they

want to within Young Marines, but we want it to be at their leisure. All of them have contributed more than we could ask to this great program. So, if you have anyone who might be interested in helping out, send them my way!

I recently attended the Adult Leadership Conference in Dallas TX. I learned a lot of valuable information and made some contacts with some of the units to our south. We are hoping to work together and do some group events with our units. One topic that came up is that HQ has mandated that all units transition to the new digital woodland camouflage uniforms. This is especially frustrating for numerous reasons. The first is obviously the cost. We currently have an excessive stock of the regular woodland uniforms; enough to last us a very long time. The other concern that was brought up was that it would make our youth look too much like actual Marines wearing a very similar uniform. Both of these issues were brought up at the conference, but the message given was this is the directive and move forward. So, we will be working on some fundraising to purchase new uniforms.

One of the next National events coming up for Young Marines is Pearl Harbor Day. The official dates have not been set yet, but I believe it's generally Dec 3rd - 8th. YM's are an essential part of the ceremony and parade for this event. I have tasked my staff to create a rough budget for a trip of this nature to see if it may be feasible for Emerald Empire Young Marines to attend. If not this year, then next year. Not only would it be an amazing experience for our Young Marines, but it would be something we could use to promote in our recruitment efforts. Our unit has some funds available due to some amazing donations, but most definitely not enough to cover new uniforms and a trip of this magnitude. So, we WILL be fundraising. If any League members have any fundraising thoughts or ideas, we are wide open!

I also wanted to make everyone aware of an event I recently came across on Facebook for Lane County Veterans Group.
