In Memory of Ruth Ann **Holland**

26 March 1946 – 19 March 2025



Ruth Holland, beloved mother, grandmother, sister, and friend, passed away peacefully at the age of 78. Ruth was born on March 26, 1946, at Junction City Hospital to Frank and Estella (Drongesen) Swiener. Ruth was raised in Harrisburg, Oregon, where she graduated high school in 1964. Shortly after graduation, she enlisted in the United States Marine Corps on July 9, 1964. During her service, some of her duties were in MCI Introduction to Personnel Administration and she earned both the Good Conduct Medal and the National Defense Service Medal. Ruth was honorably discharged in 1966, with rank of Corporal. Ruth had a love for dancing, especially the jitterbug. It was on a dance floor that she met the love of her life, Gary Holland, through a mutual friend. They married on June 15, 1968, and welcomed their son, Martin Holland, in August 1969. Professionally, Ruth worked as a bookkeeper for several automotive and RV dealerships throughout her career. In 1988, she became a dedicated member of the Eugene Moose Lodge, where she held various positions including Senior Regent and Recorder. Her

dedication earned her degrees in the Women of the Moose, including College of Regents and Star Recorder. Ruth sponsored many new members. She was known for her creativity, especially her year-round decorated Christmas tree celebrating all seasons and holidays. Ruth is survived by her son Martin H. Holland and daughter-in-law Cheryl L. Holland; her grandchildren Storm and Natasha; three great-grandsons; and four loving sisters. She was preceded in death by her husband, Gary Holland, and her brother, Jim Sweiner. A Celebration of Life will be held on April 26, at 2:00 p.m. at the Springfield Moose Lodge, with ceremonies led by the Women of the Moose and the Marine Corps League. 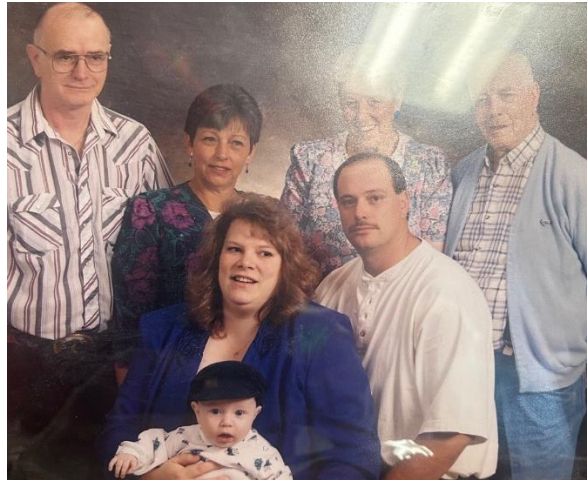

Disabled veterans

Oregon residents who are disabled veterans (**with a rating of at least 25 percent**) are eligible for a FREE combination license that includes hunting, fishing and shellfish licenses and a Columbia River Basin Endorsement.

Resident disabled veterans also can qualify for a \$26 elk tag.
First time license applicants must submit

This application, and

A letter from the U.S. Veterans Administration, or any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States, showing an overall disability rating of at least 25 percent.

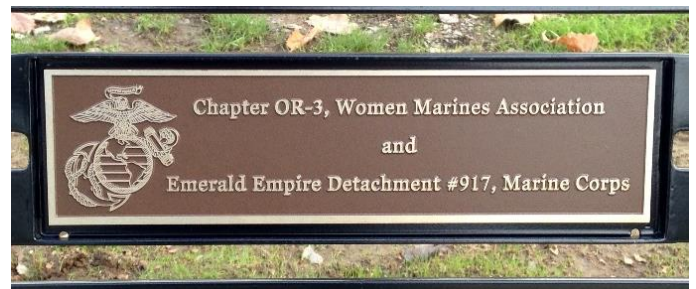
