Richard William "Bill" Call passed away on July 14, 2024.

He was born in Tillamook, Ore., to Robert J. and Leola Call on Jan. 17, 1926. Bill attended Pleasant Valley Primary School, Benson High School and Lewis & Clark College night school.

He enlisted in the US Marine Corps in January 1944, during World War II. He was assigned to the 3rd Marine Division, 3rd Tank Bn. Hdq. Co. He was part of the Guam and Iwo Jima campaigns. He was discharged in 1947.

Bill re-enlisted in the Marines in 1950 and went to Korea. He was part of the operation making the landing at Inchon and also the Chosin Few with the 1st Motor Transport Bn. 1st Marine division. He was discharged from active duty in 1951, but continued to serve in the reserves till August of 1956.

In 1951, Bill went to work at Pierce Freight Lines as an over the road truck driver. That is where he met his wife,, who also worked there. They married in 1952 after a two-month courtship. Bill continued to work for the company over the next almost 20 years and worked his way up to General Manager. He left the company in late 1970 to pursue his dream of owning his own business.

In early 1971, Bill and his wife, , purchased Reddaway Truck Line in Oregon City, Ore., a very small local trucking company. He then built it over the next 18 years into the largest regional trucking company on the West Coast. After he sold the business in 1989, Bill needed something to keep him busy, so he decided to get into commercial

real estate. He also started collecting and working on old antique cars. Bill started filling up a warehouse with his car collection. He was also the driving force behind the founding of the "Cascade Pacific Plymouth Club" in 1999. In 2006, he drove one of his old Plymouths across the United States, and on this cross-country drive he had an inspiration to become active in USMC veterans' organizations in the Portland area. He joined the 1st Marine Division Assoc. and assisted in forming the 3rd Marine Division Association. He also joined the China Marines, The Chosin Few and the Marine Corps National Motor Transport Association.

In November of 2013, at the age of 87, Bill signed up for two years to serve as part of the "Honor Guard" that attends all the Marine funerals at the Willamette National Cemetery.

Bill and his wife, , were also longtime Portland Trailblazer season ticket holders and for many years never missed a game.

Bill loved life and loved his family more than anything.

Bill is survived by his wife, , of 72 years

A private military graveside service will be held at Willamette National Cemetery on July 24, at 1 p.m.


Bill & Shirley's ceremony was the first one conducted at the New Veterans Memorial area. There was one other couple who were inurned there but there was no ceremony.
