

On 10 November 2025, Emerald Empire Detachment #917, Marine Corps League, conducted an informal cake cutting ceremony to celebrate the 250<sup>th</sup> Birthday of the United States Marine Corps.



The tables were decorated, the cake was ready, and the toasting Whiskey was ready to go.

The first part of the program was the arrival and social visting.













This was followed by the sounding of Attention, and the playing of the National Athem.

The first step in the cake cutting ceremony was the reading of Order 47 from General John A. Lejeune, followed by the video message from the current Marine Corps Commandant Eric M.

Smith and the Sergeant Major of the Marine Corps Carlos A. Ruiz.





Then it was time to present the Oldest and the Youngest Marines present.



The Oldest Marine was Bobby Graves. Bobby was born in August of 1937 (age 88).

Bobby Graves – August 1937 – Bobby started out joining the Oregon National Guard in 1954, then the United States Marine Corps on 10 September 1954, Pendleton January 1955, Japan 1957-59, Tiawan 1958 Combat Zone, Cherry Point 1959-1960, El Toro 1961-63. Discharged COG after the Cuban Missle deal. Served with 186 Inf Tank Co with the National Guard, and MAW in USMC. He is a Life Member of VFW Springfield and Marine Corps League. Bobby has also been a long time teacher of karate, and a member for 70 years of the Japan Karate Association and University of Oregon for 20 years.

The **Youngest Marine** was Anthony (AJ) Lonberg at age 26.

<u>Anthony Lonberg</u> – Enlisted in the Marines in 2017 and served until 2019. Anthony finished Marine Corps Boot Camp at Marine Corps Recruit Depot San Diego, California. He completed

Infantry Training Basic at Camp Pendleton, Caliofornia, and then completed Security Force School in Virgina. He served in Security Forces at Bremerton, Washington.

AJ had brain surgery at the University of Washington Medical School to address ongoing seizures from Epilepsy. He has recovery and additional procedures (to fine tune implanted electrodes to address the epilepsy seizures) ahead of him.







The cake was cut by Paul Grinde. The presentation of cake was done by Debbie Barker. The first piece going to the Oldest Marine Bobby Graves and the second piece of cake going to the Youngest Marine AJ Lonberg.

Cake was then served to all those present. This was followed by the Memorial Toast to Jess M. Wise, Jr., who many years before had begun the Toast Making Event.



Following the toast was the reading of the Desceased Members of the Emerald Emprie Detachment #917, Marine Corps League. TAPS was then played.


The last event of the evening was the singing of the Marine's Hymn (all 3 verses). This concluded the ceremony.

Allen Truesdale – USMC Combat Vietnam Vet, Native American (Cherokee & Zuni), and VA Clinic volunteer.


