Subject: NJA Ruling - Management of Notice of Death Forms

This letter serves as an official ruling regarding how to forward on the Notice of Death form.

Effective immediately, until a proposed amendment to Section 7010 is adopted at the 2026 National Convention, the following shall be done handling the Notice of Death forms.

The method of transmitting Notice of Death forms (NOD's) shall be by email. The required recipients of the NOD include:

- Department Chaplain
- Division Chaplain
- National Chaplain
- Detachment Paymaster
- Membership Manager at National Headquarters

The official Notice of Death form, available in the Member Library on the MCL National website, has been updated to reflect these recipients.

Physical mailing, as described in the current Section 7010, is no longer required.

Purpose of This Ruling:

This interpretation removes the confusion within Section 7010 of whom, and how, the NOD needs to be forwarded to and aligns with the League's current technological capabilities and reduces administrative burden while maintaining compliance with existing procedures until formal adoption of a proposed amendment.

PLM Audit Instructions

- Each Detachment must annually verify the listing of Life Members.
- The **Detachment Commandant and Paymaster** must sign and date the Audit.
- Once the list has been verified and signed, it must be sent to the **Department Paymaster** via email. PLM Audit submissions via USPS may be done with Department Paymaster approval on a case-by-case basis.
- The Department Paymaster will ensure the PLM Audit is properly signed and dated.
- The PLM Audit must be emailed to the **Membership Supervisor** by the **Department Paymaster** not later than 12/31 annually. It is highly recommended that it be emailed by the end of November to allow time for errors to be corrected. Membership Supervisor email: JFoster@MCLeague.org
- Submissions received after 12/31 will not be accepted.
- If the Detachment was eligible for PLM Distribution at the time of submission and followed the proper instructions, but the audit failed to be received by the Membership Supervisor by 12/31 the Detachment shall be made whole of eligible PLM Distribution by the Department.

NOTE:

- Sending does not constitute receiving. Ensure email addresses are correct.
- Notice of Death forms must be completed by the Detachment and submitted by normal process for those members who are deceased.
- Life members do not become eligible for interest payout until the second anniversary of their Life Join date.
- Deceased members are not eligible for payout of PLM interest money starting the fiscal year they are marked deceased.
- The Audit must be received by December 31st of the same year. If the audits are received at National Headquarters after the December 31st cutoff date, the Detachment will not receive funds from National Headquarters.

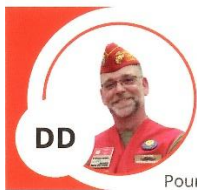

Community Service Records

Need to complete these records and include in the Reports submitted for National Mid-Winter (August – February), and National Convention (August – July).

Northwest Division Commandant will be requested reports this coming 1 July 2026, so prepare now.

**National Conventions are:
Mid-Winter = 2nd week of February
National Convention = 2nd week of August**

Include Hours, activities and mileage. These can be for Marine Corps League functions/activities or community functions/activities. All this information is tallied and converted to a price per hour figure. The last conversion was determined to equate to \$34.00 per hour.

Officers (all levels) need to ensure they pass on information to their replacements. Binders of information for each position was recommended.

Question was raised as to why detachments are 501(c)4, instead of 501(c)19. The 501(c)19 requires a certain percentage of Wartime Veterans, as where the 501(c)4 does not, since it is considered more of a fraternal organization.

Food served from 6:30 – 8:00 p.m. Each person will receive 2 drink tickets that can be used on soda, water, beer, or wine. PK PARK CLEAR BAG POLICY

Bag Policy - To provide a safer environment for the public and significantly expedite fan entry into stadiums, the Eugene Emeralds have implemented a clear bag policy that limits the size and type of bags that may be brought into PK Park. Exceptions to this policy will be made for diaper and medical bags, but fans will need to have these bags properly inspected.

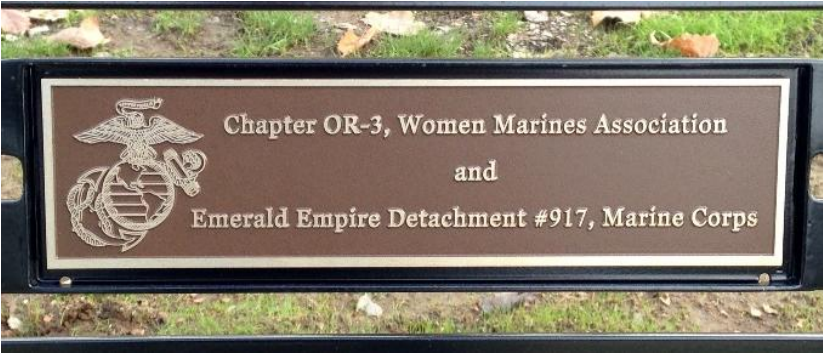
The Emeralds strongly encourage fans to not bring any type of bags, but fans will be able to carry the following style and size bag, package, or container:

- Bags that are clear plastic, vinyl or PCV and do not exceed 12" x 6" x 12"
- No buckles, grommets/hardware, or décor can be concealing any part of the bag
- One-gallon clear plastic freezer bag (Ziplock bag or similar)
- Small clutch bags, approximately the size of a hand, with or without handle or strap, may be taken into the venue (can't be larger than 4.5" x 6.5")

•
Approved Items:

- Clear plastic, vinyl, or PVC bags that do not exceed 12" x 6" x 12" or one-gallon clear plastic storage bag (one per person)
- Small clutch bags that do not exceed 4.5" x 6.5" (approx. the size of a hand), with or without a handle or strap
- Factory sealed plastic water bottles
- Empty water bottles (please note that water bottles containing liquid will not be allowed)
- Medical liquids
- Baby bottles
- Binoculars (not in cases)
- Blankets
- Cameras for still photography (not in cases)
- Seat cushions

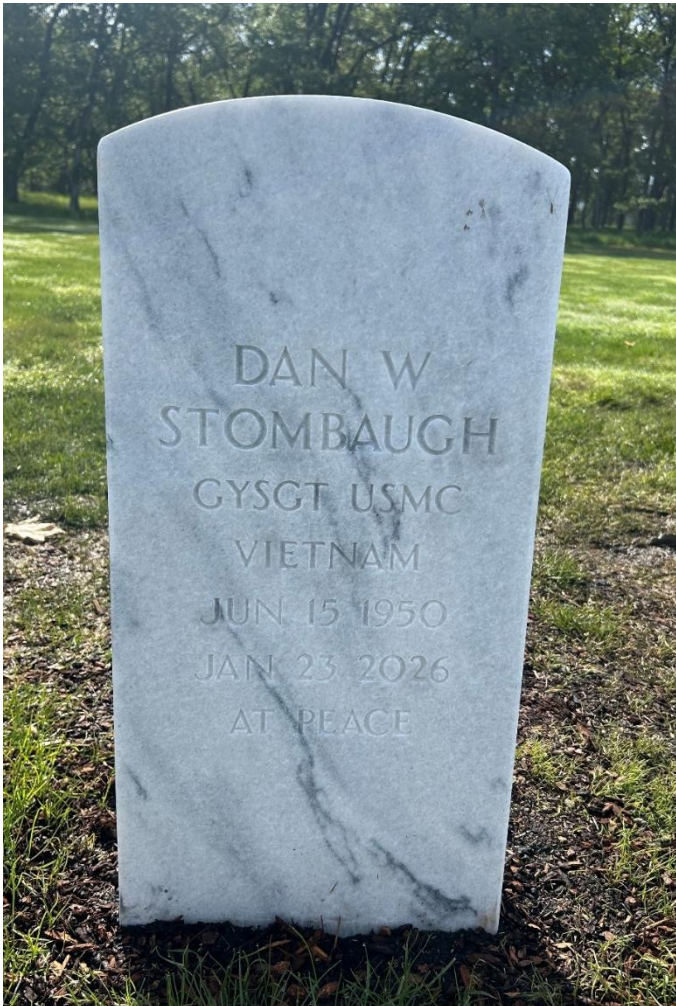

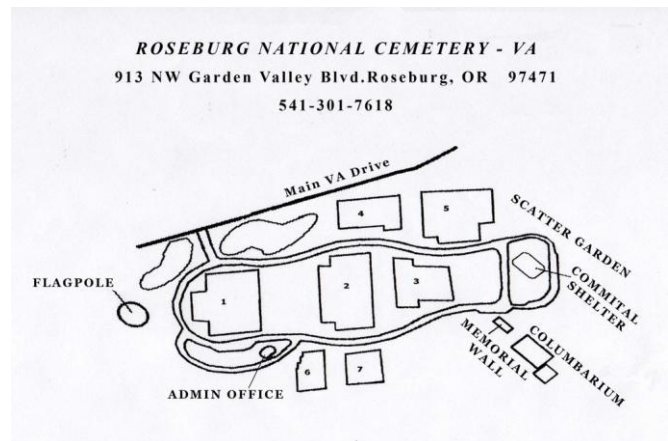
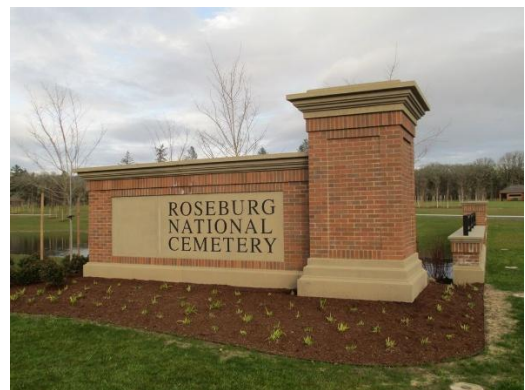
